Two young women - two stories. A rapper in Dakar and a wrestler in southern Senegal: Toussa and Emodj. They both strive for victory and recognition in male-dominated spheres and a patriarchal society. "Mane" - "Me", in the language Wolof - tells a modern, positive and trend-setting story of two young women and their universal truth: only we ourselves can bring about change, out of our own ambition and will.

In seeking to mend her grandmother's broken destiny, Natie also hopes to find herself. Will she succeed in freeing herself?

After a failed plot against his crown, King Pazouknaam appoints his cousin Katanga as the head of the army. Aware of the heavy responsibility, Katanga consults a sooth-sayer for guidance in fulfilling his mission. With KATANGA, LA DANSE DES SCORPIONS, Dani Kouyaté reimagines Shakespeare's Macbeth as a universal political tale set in Africa. The film won the Yennenga Golden Stallion at FESPACO 2025.

MANGROVE SCHOOL

Sónia Vaz Borges, Filipa César

Guinea-Bissau, Portugal France, Spain, Germany, 2022, 35 min, color, Experimental Documentary Portuguese with English subtitles

During Guinea-Bissau's struggle for independence between 1963 and 1974, led by the agricultural engineer, political organizer, and poet Amílcar Cabral, an ambitious education programme was launched to fight Portuguese colonial power. The revolutionaries built more than 150 schools in the liberated zones, at least one of them was hidden in the tidal mangrove forest, made from natural materials at hand

Tales from the Source offers a gaze on the landscapes of the Democratic Republic of Congo to translate a sense of its unfathomable power, diversity and knowledge. The scenery is presented as a character acting as a living entity and inhabited by the symbolism of Congolese traditions. The visual approach borrows techniques from multispectral imaging, resulting in an otherworldly experience with surreal lights and colour.

Creole, Portuguese with English subtitles

Guinea-Bissau, 1969. A violent war between the Portuguese colonial army and the guerrillas of the African Party for the Independence of Guinea and Cape Verde. Nome leaves his village and joins the maquis. After years, he will return as a hero, but joy will soon give way to bitterness and cynicism. A special feature of Nome is the archival footage from the time originally shot by Na N'Hada and his comrades.

Nadia Denton has worked in the UK film industry for over a decade as an Impact Producer and Curator, specializing in Nigerian Cinema and coining the term BEYOND NOLLYWOOD. Her books include The Nigerian Filmmaker's Guide to Success: Beyond Nollywood. She has collaborated with institutions such as the BFI London Film Festival, EFM at Berlinale, Doc Society, London Film School, Sundance Film Festival, and Comic Relief. Nadia is also an Honorary Research Fellow at the University of Exeter.

Sandra Krampelhuber is a filmmaker, festival curator, and cultural anthropologist. Her documentaries – including Queens of Sound – A Herstory of Reggae and Dancehall (2006), 100% Dakar – more than art (2014), Accra Power (2016), and Mane (2020) – have been shown at international film festivals worldwide. Currently, she is finishing her new documentary film Letter of a Woman (2026). She is the initiator and curator of CINÉMA AFRICAIN! International Film Festival in Linz, known for its transnational approach and focus on African and African diasporic perspectives.


Lesedi Oluko Moche is a creative producer, festival programmer, and development coach working across film, television, podcasts, and cultural projects. She translates African lived realities into compelling narratives and has contributed to projects across Africa. She produced Late Night with Kgomotso, Rise Young Women's Talk Show, co-produced the podcast VINTAGE OR VIOLENCE, and develops storytelling strategies for advocacy and corporate projects. Former chair of the Documentary Filmmakers Association, she was named in Mail & Guardian's Women Changing South Africa (2018).

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
